- Empire, America, Europe
- Which was to have priority?
- What should Britain's role be after Empire?



Britain has lost an Empire and not yet found a role....Britain's attempt to play a separate power role - that is, a role apart from Europe, a role based on a 'special relationship' with the United States, a role based on being the head of a Commonwealth which has no political structure or unity or strength and enjoys a fragile and precarious economic relationship - this role is about played out. *Dean Acheson* 12/12/62





Two Referendums on EEC/EU

- 1975
 - Yes: 17.4 million (67 per cent)
 - No: 8.5 million (33 per cent)
- 2016

Leave: 17.4 million (52 per cent) Remain: 16.1 million (48 per cent)

Does Brexit make sense?
